



Whitewater rafting is a must-do for anyone

Don't just take photos of the river; take on the river. Hold on to your paddles and raft the water that jet boats fear. With three rivers to choose from, and a variety of unique rapids, we have the rafting experience for you:

Shotover River – grade 3-5 rapids

The mighty Shotover River in the infamous Skippers Canyon is well-known for its cliff edges, scenery, and gold mining history, making the drive to the experience a big part of the fun. Encounter the whitewater action and soak up the atmosphere, with a climactic raft through a 170-metre tunnel. Opt to go full actionhero and transport your guests into the canyon via a

Kawarau River – grade 2-3 rapids

For all Lord of the Rings fans, choose to paddle through serene middle-earth, and go on the hunt for iconic film locations. Raft under the world's first Bungy operation and enjoy Aotearoa New Zealand's longest commercially rafted rapid. With heaps of whitewater action, chances to swim rapids and options to go cliff jumping, the Kawarau is a real feel-good experience the whole team can get behind.

Landsborough rafting – grade 3-5 rapids

Immerse the team in the real rugged wilderness of the West Coast on a three-day guided rafting adventure. Paddle through grade 3-5 rapids in the Landsborough Valley, taking in the surrounding dense rainforest, hanging glaciers, and native wildlife. Relax at the end of the day's activities with well-deserved three-course meals, local wine, and a helicopter flight included. A perfect mix of tranquillity and pure adventure.

This trip has a limited number of participants, with a group capacity of 12 adventurers, making it a perfect corporate team-building activity.



Nestled deep in Fiordland, Doubtful Sound is an adventure to travel to. With a cruise across the stunning Lake Manapouri, and a spectacular drive over the alpine Wilmot Pass, guests are guaranteed to be awed by its beauty and to fall in love with it, just like Les and Olive did.











Te Anau Glowworm Caves

Travel beneath the Murchison Mountains on Lake Te Anau's western shores and discover a real hidden gem; the subterranean network of caves, illuminated by thousands of glowworms.

A visit to this underground system transports you to another world. Though the caves are 12,000 years young, they are still being carved by the force of the river that flows through them. The result is twisting limestone passages exhibiting sculpted rock, whirlpools and a roaring underground waterfall.

Deep inside the caves, beyond the noise of the water, thousands of glowworms inhabit a silent hidden grotto. They produce a glittering display that is truly extraordinary. Drift in silence below the shimmering creatures in a small vessel steered in complete darkness by our expert guides.









Rakiura **Stewart Island**

If it's a flying visit to the 'real' South Island of Aotearoa New Zealand, or if you're looking for a longer island retreat, we can provide your guests with a complete island itinerary to experience the best that Rakiura Stewart Island has to offer.

Located beyond the southernmost point of New Zealand's South Island, Rakiura Stewart Island is a cruisy one-hour daily ferry service from Bluff. Aboard our comfortable catamarans, large parties can easily zip between Bluff and Rakiura Stewart Island, where they may have opportunities to spot sea birds and seals.

The Island is New Zealand's ultimate eco-tourism destination well off the beaten track, but only 30 km from the southern tip of the South Island. Most of the island's lush forest, rocky coastlines and creamy golden sand beaches are protected within the Rakiura National Park. Settlement is mainly confined to Oban, the only township on the island.







Wild Kiwi Encounter

Set out on a quest to encounter the legendary wild kiwi in their natural habitat. Depart from Halfmoon Bay before dusk and catch the sunset over the ocean. Once on the water, enjoy a twilight cruise, reaching Little Glory Cove as night falls.



During the cruise, pass Ulva Island (Rakiura's predator-free wildlife sanctuary) and learn about the native wildlife endemic to the shores. Once at Little Glory Cove, follow the Nature Guide by starlight through the coastal forest to the kiwi's beach haunt. Tune into the sounds of the forest, and here, in the darkness, you may spot the Rakiura Tokoeka (kiwi) typically found searching for food.

Village and Bays Tour

Explore Oban Village and its surrounding bays with a local guide. This is the best introduction to Rakiura Stewart Island.

Unspoiled, serene, and brimming full of stories, Rakiura Stewart Island is well worth this introduction. Hop off the bus for short walks, and plenty of photo stops along the way. Discover the history of the island, spot the European, Māori and American cultures and stand on top of Observation Rock with its stunning views of Golden Bay, Paterson Inlet and Ulva Island. Your local guide will also provide insight into unique island life.



Ulva Island Explorer

Enjoy a leisurely cruise of Paterson Inlet, tracing unspoiled beaches and hidden coves, before exploring the unmissable Ulva Island Birdlife Sanctuary.

Once on the island, feel immersed in the forest, and be spellbound by the weka (native woodhen), bush robins, rare saddlebacks, and yellowheads, amongst other rare and endangered species. Enjoy a minimum 45-minute guided walk through the protected habitat of some of Aotearoa New Zealand's rarest plant species.



Guided Wilderness Walk



Uncover the fascinating stories of Oneke "The Neck" on a small group guided walk.

Take a short sea cruise to this secluded and special area, full of unique history, beautiful coastal landscapes, and native wildlife. Your local guide will take you along trails from regenerative bush to rugged beach, identify wildlife, and tell stories of the island's rich Māori and European history.
